It has been noticed that certain malicious elements are spreading fake news and vicious rumors regarding the COVID-19 pandemic on online communication channels, internet, social media and various messaging platforms to cause panic, commit crime and disturb the public order in the state. In the time of such an epidemic, it is the duty of every citizens to stay informed and be responsible with what they share on social media.

The Maharashtra cyber department is advising any persons or organization to refrain from engaging in spreading fake news and rumors on various social media platforms and also traditional media sources and mischievous and harmful behavior which will disturb the public order. If it comes your notice about any person/ organization is involved in spreading/creating/publishing rumors / fake news or misinformation on any forms of media or messaging platform, it is encouraged to report it to the nearest police station/ cyber police station or lodge complaint at www.cybercrime.gov.in. Maharashtra Cyber police will take stringent action against those found spreading fake news / rumors or misinformation about the Corona virus disease.

As per the notification of Government of Maharashtra, Public Health Department dated 14th March 2020, "The Maharashtra COVID-19 Regulations 2020" has been released. This advisory is in lines to the The Maharashtra COVID-19 Regulations 2020 and any person / Institution / organization is found indulging in such activity, they will be held responsible and necessary action will be taken under

Section 3 of THE EPIDEMIC DISEASES ACT, 1897

"Any person disobeying any regulation or order made under this Act shall be deemed to have committed an offence punishable under section 188 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860"

In light of the global pandemic, we urge the citizens to rely on official sources for all the information related to the COVID-19 for reliable and updated information.
